



PREP TERM 4 OVERVIEW

Excellence
& Honour

English

Prep students explore the enchanting world of fairy tales, focusing on building their oral language skills. The unit is designed to immerse students in classic stories, encouraging them to explore characters, settings, and events. Through engaging activities, students will understand story structure, and confidently retell tales orally. Students will continue to read and write all alphabet sounds, digraphs and begin exploring CVCC / CCVC words. They will compose and punctuate their own simple sentences, using their knowledge of the alphabetic code. Students will practise dictated writing, using 2- 3 sentences that contain words made up from taught sounds. Students will practise writing lower- and upper-case letters on lines with the correct formation.

Spanish

Students will be introduced to seasons, feelings and emotions. They will be familiarising themselves with the basic Spanish words and the distinctive sounds through interactions and activities.

Visual Arts

Students will explore ideas and create a collection of artworks that represent stories and experiences through collage and mixed media.

Physical Education and Health

In PE, students will develop cooperative skills through play-based activities. Students will solve a range of movement challenges using fundamental movement skills.

Mathematics

This Term students will:

- count by naming numbers in sequences, initially to and from 20, moving from any starting point
- Subitise small collections of objects
- Compare, order and make correspondences between collections, initially to 20, and explain reasoning
- Connect number names, numerals and quantities, including zero, initially up to 10 and then beyond
- Compare and order duration of events using everyday language of time
- Connect days of the week to familiar events and actions

Dance

Students will make and perform dance sequences and demonstrate safe dance practice. Students describe what happens in dance they make, perform and view.

Media Arts

Students explore the existence and impact of sound as a representation of settings and characters.

Humanities and Social Sciences

Students will continue to explore what familiar places are like and what makes them special. They will observe and represent the location and features of places using pictorial maps and models and describe special places.
